

Emergency Department Mayo Clinic Hospital Phoenix Campus

Overview

The Emergency Department at Mayo Clinic Hospital, Phoenix Campus, is a 24 bed department, committed to providing the highest quality care. Our dedicated team of professionals includes residency trained, Board Certified Emergency Physicians and Registered Nurses with advanced training in adult and pediatric emergencies. Other members of the health care team include: Nurse Manager, Supervisors, Unit Based Educator, Quality Manager, Core Team Leads, Orthopedic Techs, Unit Secretaries, and Volunteers.

One of the few JCAHO Certified Stroke Centers in the state of Arizona, Mayo Clinic continues to strive for excellence in its care of stroke patients. Our Stroke Neurologists are on call 24 hours a day and respond to all CVA's presented to the Emergency Department. In addition to TPA therapy, MCH also participates in research drug clinical trials for the management of patients presented with an acute CVA. This can extend the time frame up to 9 hours from the onset of symptoms if the criteria are met.

Mayo Clinic has an extensive transplant program, which consists of kidney, pancreas, bone marrow, and liver (including Live Liver and Heart transplants). Mayo Clinic's Emergency Department is able to meet the needs of all of our patients waiting transplantation and post transplant with specialized equipment (i.e. VAD's).

Our Door to Reperfusion for MI patients going to Cath Lab meets the National Standard of 90 minutes.

Our emergency physicians are able to make referrals for comprehensive, integrated, and interdisciplinary care via the vast Mayo Clinic network at the Scottsdale Campus.

- All patient rooms in the newly renovated Emergency Department have state of the art Solar 800 Hardwire Monitoring with 12 Lead EKG capabilities
- Telemetry Monitoring is available in remote areas of the Emergency Department
- Shared Governance Model with active unit based committees (Practice, Quality, Service, Triage, and Staffing and Scheduling)
- Online self scheduling via the ICS Boomerang System
- Assignments made using an acuity-based system and patient volumes. Typical assignments are:
 - 3-4 patients per RN
- **Unit Based Educator** tailors an orientation specific to the needs of the employee and meets the educational needs of the department

- **RN Case Manager** assigned to the Emergency Department and Social Services
- Crisis workers available 24 hours a day on call
- Win Pfs patient tracking and acuity system to assist in staffing productivity measurements and guidelines
- The department is active in volunteering in community based educational projects and Mayo Clinic provides the healthcare at sporting events (FBR Open)

Shift options

- 12 hour shifts with varying start times (7am, 9am, 11am, 12pm, 3pm, and 7pm)
- Fulltime/Part-time/Supplemental /PRN

Requirements

- Compact State or current Arizona RN license required upon date of hire
- Pals, BLS, and ACLS required
- TNCC within 6 months of hire
- ENPC and CEN preferred
