Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation for Depression

Transcranial magnetic stimulation (TMS) is a noninvasive alternative treatment for moderately treatment-resistant depressed patients or patients who are intolerant of antidepressant medications. During studies of TMS treatment for depression, adult patients and adolescents who also experience chronic pain have shown improvement in their pain.

Single-incision Proctocolectomy and Ileal J-pouch Reconstruction

A 19-year-old Arizona woman is believed to be the second patient in the U.S. to have her entire large intestine removed via a single-incision, minimally invasive surgery. A new rectum (J-pouch) was constructed for the patient using the end portion of the small intestine. The J-pouch eliminates the need for permanent ileostomy.

Infliximab for Ulcerative Colitis

Patients' most-feared outcome of treatment for ulcerative colitis is surgical removal of the colon. Treatment with infliximab reduced the need for colectomy by 41 percent in patients with ulcerative colitis in a recent Mayo Clinic study. Infliximab was already known to induce and maintain levels of clinical response and remission and valve healing. [Learn more and view video](#) of William Sandborn, M.D.

Mucosal Esophageal Adenocarcinoma (EAC) in Barrett's Esophagus

Early stage cancers of the esophagus can be treated as effectively by less-invasive, organ-sparing endoscopic therapy as by surgical removal of the esophagus, a recent Mayo Clinic study found. Survival in patients with mucosal EAC when treated endoscopically appears to be comparable with that of patients treated surgically. Recurrent carcinoma can also be managed endoscopically.
