Dr. Greene is an associate professor of medicine at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota. He is a board-certified internist and nephrologist, focusing on the medical care of patients with kidney disease. Dr. Greene's research and clinical investigation have focused on the physiology and pathophysiology of mechanisms associated with the progression of chronic kidney disease.

His appointments at Mayo Clinic have included director of the Office for Diversity in Education; vice-chair of the Mayo Medical School Admissions Committee; member of the Mayo Clinic Rochester Personnel Committee; director of the Mayo Clinic CTSA/CCatS Health Disparities Education Group; chair of the Mayo Clinic Charity Care Committee; and president of the Officers and Councilors of the Mayo Clinic Voting Staff.

On the national level, Dr. Greene was a founding member and past president of the National Institutes of Health - National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases National Minority Research Investigators group. He is currently a member of the American Society of Nephrology Communications Committee, associate editor of the journal *Diabetes Care*, and serves as a member of the National Advisory Council of the NIH Institute on Health Disparities.
