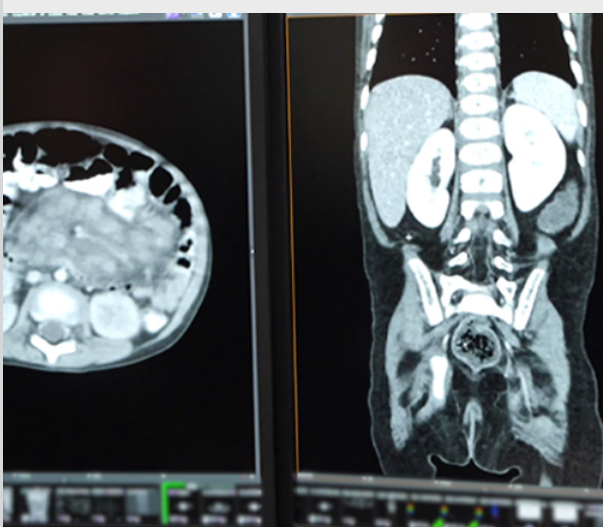
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Pediatric myopia clinic: Prioritizing early intervention and research

Assessing the long-term risk of mood and anxiety disorders after pediatric TBI

Pediatric traumatic brain injuries (TBIs) are associated with an estimated 500,000 emergency department visits and 18,000 hospitalizations every year. Because TBI is a leading cause of morbidity in children, a Mayo Clinic study sought to learn more about the long-term effects of TBI in children. The results were published in a 2023 issue of the Journal of Head Trauma Rehabilitation.
