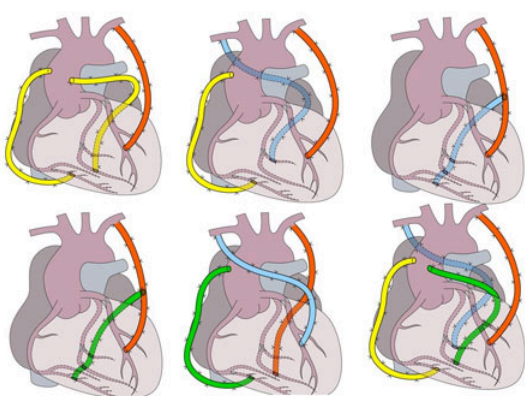

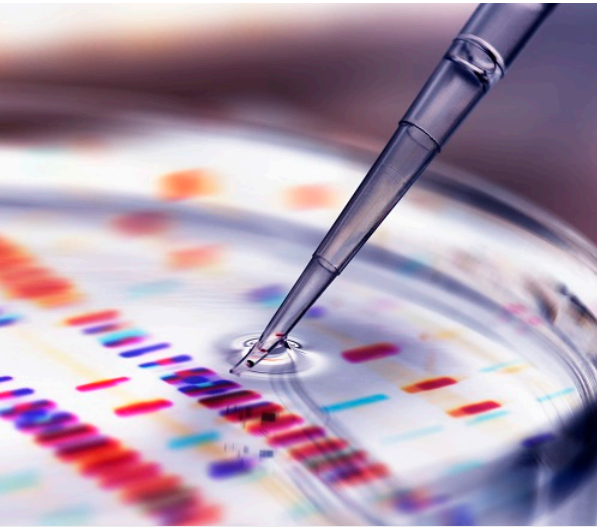

A Mayo Clinic cardiovascular surgeon explains what you need to know about coronary artery bypass grafting (CABG), from durable solutions to new innovations.

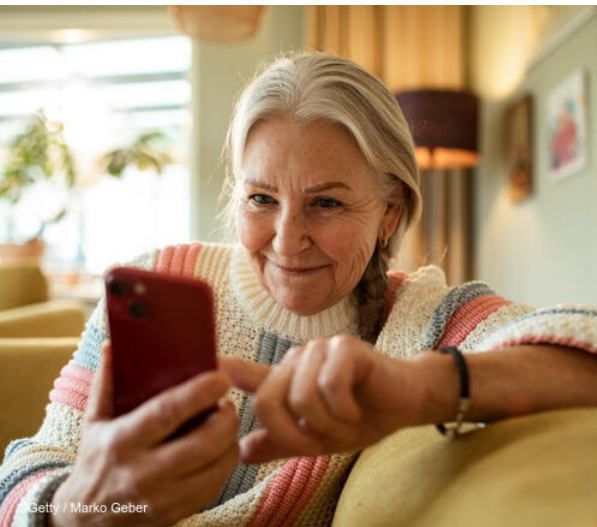
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First FDA-approved retinal gene therapy now available

Home rehabilitation for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease

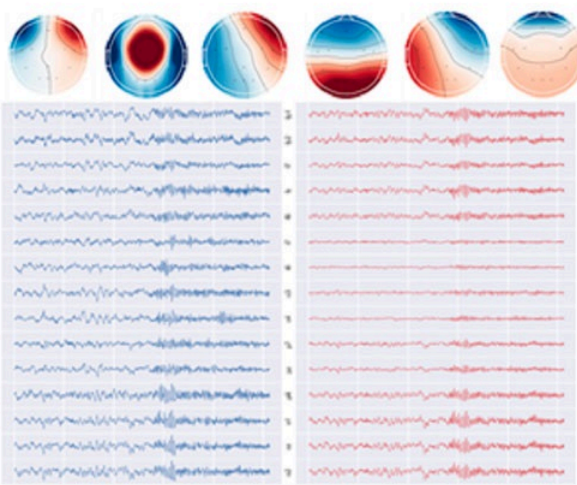
