## HANDS-ON SIMULATORS

Sophisticated endoscopic simulators will be available for hands-on use by course registrants who sign up for this optional afternoon activity. These technologies allow the participant to train and/or test their skills with colonoscopy, ERCP, and specific endoscopic therapies, such as the management of GI bleeding. In addition surgical laparoscopic simulators will be available. A limited number of simulators will be available Tuesday – Thursday in half-hour sessions from 1:30-4:00 pm as an alternative to leisure and recreational activities. *Pre-registration is required via the course registration form.* Every effort will be made to accommodate the session of your choice, based on the order it is received. Your session will be confirmed in your course confirmation letter.

### ENDOSCOPY LEARNING CENTER

The Endoscopy Learning Center is a collection of more than 50 videotapes developed by the American Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy. These tapes, with audio commentary, demonstrate both basic and advanced procedures.
