Dr. McLaughlin is division chair of General Surgery at Mayo Clinic in Florida; the medical director of the Robert and Monica Jacoby Center for Breast Health; a professor of Surgery; and the program director for the General Surgery Residency. She's also a member of the Florida Executive Operations Leadership Team.

She completed her General Surgery residency training at Mayo Clinic in Florida followed by a Breast Surgical Oncology fellowship at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center. Dr. McLaughlin joined the staff of Mayo Clinic in 2007.

Dr. McLaughlin has an active breast surgery clinical and research practice with a history of intramural, state and federal/National Institutes of Health research funding. Her research specifically focuses on issues affecting breast cancer survivorship, especially lymphedema diagnosis and treatment.

As a surgeon, Dr. McLaughlin treats patients with breast cancer, breast health concerns and lymphedema. She is a co-chair of the Mayo Clinic enterprise Breast Specialty Council. She has been integral in developing Mayo Clinic's integrated, multidisciplinary model of breast care.

Dr. McLaughlin is a member of multiple national organizations, serves on the executive council for the Society of Surgical Oncology and is a fellow of the American College of Surgeons. In addition, she serves on several national committees interested in the education of breast surgeons, breast surgery and Complex General Surgical Oncology fellows, and general surgery residents.

Mayo Clinic has recognized Dr. McLaughlin as a Mayo Clinic Foundation Scholar; Outstanding Course Director; Faculty Teacher of the Year; and Outstanding Continuing Medical Education Faculty. The City of Jacksonville, Florida named Dr. McLaughlin a "Healthcare Hero" for her contributions to the Jacksonville breast cancer community.
